課程概述 Course Descriptions	<p>This course introduces critical reading and writing as essential skills for engaging with contemporary sociocultural issues. Drawing on methods from literary and cultural studies, students analyze how cultural meanings are produced, circulated, and contested through texts and everyday practices. Through essays, fiction, academic articles, and films, the course examines sociocultural issues related to language and representation, identity and subjectivity, media and popular culture, and the cultural politics of power. Emphasizing humanities-based inquiry, the course helps students develop their ability to evaluate arguments, recognize different perspectives, and produce evidence-based writing to express informed positions on current sociocultural topics.</p> <p>Please make sure to arrive on time during the first week of the semester for enrollment confirmation and course announcements.</p> <p>開學第一週請務必準時出席。</p>

If you submit or present AI-generated materials as your own without substantive rewriting and proper acknowledgment, it may be considered a violation of academic integrity, potentially resulting in a zero grade for the assignment.</p>
